





















MVTC Members T-Bird Stories



A little history about Roger & Shirley. Roger bought the '57' Thunderbird in 1978 and soon after joined the MVTC and is now an Honorary, Lifetime, Charter Member. The bird is Colonial White.

Roger & Shirley were married December 22, 1989. They actually knew each other early in life. Roger's father and Shirley's father went to Veteran's School in Delta, OH. While their parents were in class, the children would play together



outside.

Shirley was 3 years old and Roger was 6 years old. They are a blended family of 5 children, 9 grandchildren and 6 great- grandchildren. In 2002, at the Homestead Kiwanis Show car National at Michigan International Speedway, they took 1st place out of 3,567 cars for Best of Show.

DANBURY, Conn. — Mary Travers, one-third of the hugely popular 1960s folk trio Peter, Paul, and Mary,

died yesterday. She was 72 and had battled leukemia for several years.

She joined forces with Peter Yarrow and Noel

Paul Stookey in the early 1960s. They mingled their music with liberal politics, both onstage and off. Their version of "If I Had a Hammer" became an anthem for racial equality. Other hits included "Lemon Tree," "Leaving on a Jet Plane" and "Puff (The Magic Dragon.)"

They were early champions of Bob Dylan and performed his "Blowin' in the Wind" at the August, 1963, March on Washington.

They were vehement in their opposition to the Vietnam War yet managed to stay true to their liberal beliefs while creating music that resonated in the American mainstream.


The group collected five

Grammy Awards.

The group disbanded in 1971, launching solo careers — Travers released five albums — that never achieved the heights of their collaborations. Over the years they gave several reunion concerts.

A boxed set of their music was released in 2004.






